S.R.O. No. 351/2006 — Whereas the association known as the Communist Party of India (Maoist) with the avowed objective of overthrowing the lawfully established Government, is indulging in the following unlawful activities, namely:-

(i) Indulging in and propagating acts of violence, terrorism and vandalism in order to generate fear and apprehension in the public to subserve its interests and objectives;

(ii) Interfering with and running a parallel administration of law by holding the so called 'Prajā Courts' under threats and duress unauthorisedly punishing the alleged culprits and delivering illegal verdicts;

(iii) Organising and indulging in the grabbing of lands from persons in lawful possession and also of Government lands thus constituting a danger to public order;

(iv) Inciting innocent tribals and weaker sections of the society to take to violence and encouraging and preaching systematic disobedience to established law and its institutions and obstructing execution of the developmental activities of the Government;

(v) Forcing the people to boycott elections by threat and coercion and interfering with the democratic system and implementation of the election laws;

(vi) Threatening public representatives to relinquish their offices;

(vii) Threatening contractors not to undertake developmental activities in interior areas and kidnapping their workers from the work sites to intimidate them and also to extort money from them;

(viii) Committing gruesome killings, and maiming the individuals to terrorize their opponents and law abiding citizens, Government Officials and people's representatives;

(ix) Extorting money and materials forcibly to secure the means necessary for them to carry out their unlawful activities;

(x) Attacking police stations, police personnel and para-military personnel, snatching their weapons and interfering with the maintenance of law and order;

(xi) Threatening and abducting persons, including Government Officials, in order to coerce them into accepting their demands;

(xii) Attacking, burning, blowing up, and destroying by landmines and claymore mines the public properties like Police Stations, Railway Stations, Buses, Government Offices, Telephone Exchanges causing disruption of communication by rail and road;

(xiii) Forming and nurturing front organisations among labour and tribals and inciting them to commit unlawful activities, jeopardizing public order;

And whereas the State Government are of the opinion that in view of its indulgence in the aforesaid unlawful activities, the said Communist Party of India (Maoist) interferes and has for its object interference with the administration of the law and with the maintenance law and order and also it constitutes a danger to the public peace;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Indian Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1908 (Act 14 of 1908) the State Government hereby declare the Communist Party of India (Maoist) to be an unlawful association with immediate effect.
