EXAMINATION IN ODIA

The Examination in Odia shall consist of the papers as prescribed for OAS officers in Odisha Administrative Service Class-II (Probation and Departmental Examination) Rules,1989.

An officer who has passed the High School Certificate Examination conducted by the Board of Secondary Education, Odisha or an examination equivalent or superior thereto in Odia medium or with Odia as one of the subjects shall on application in that behalf and production of proof of such passing, be exempted from passing the examination in Odia.

N:B:— All the four papers are with Books. There shall be maximum 5 or 6 questions with equal marks for the 150 full marks in each paper with duration of three (3) hours and all the questions are compulsorily required to be attempted. Care to be taken by Examination paper setter to cover the subjects as far as possible and special care to be taken to include preparation of Journal, Ledger and Balance sheet in Accounts Paper-I and also to include at least one question from the Cost Accounting subject.

Viva Voce test and its marking for Law Part-I, Law Part-II and Odia language remains intact as is prevalent.
