RESOLUTION

The 3rd June 2005

SUBJECT—Fee-structure for Private Un-aided Professional Colleges/Institutions imparting B. E./B. Tech. Architecture, Marine Engineering, M. C. A. and M. Tech. Courses for the academic sessions 2004-05, 2005-06 and 2006-07.

Consequent upon the judgement of Hon'ble Apex Court, dated the 14th August 2003 in W. P. (c) No. 350/1993 (Islamic Academy of Education and another *Vrs.* State of Karnatak and others), Government of Orissa was pleased to constitute a Committee vide this Department Notification No. 7859, dated the 6th May 2004 to decide the fee-structure for Private Un-aided Professional Colleges/Institutions. The Committee was headed by Hon'ble Justice P.K. Patra (Retd.), Orissa High Court and started functioning from the 13th September 2004.

The Committee after detailed exercise in scrutinising the Books of Accounts, relevant records and proposals submitted by different Private Professional Colleges/Institutions and taking into consideration all other factors such as guidelines fixed by Government, A.I.C.T.E. norms, future expansion of the Institutions/Colleges and above all following the aforesaid directive of Hon'ble Apex Court and after due deliberation on the factors mentioned above, submitted its report to Government on the 31st March 2005 suggesting following fee-structure for various professional courses for the years 2004-2005, 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 which will be binding on all Un-aided Private Professional Colleges/Institutions of Orissa.

1. For Engineering Courses (including Architecture)—
 - (a) Tution Fee—Rs.30,000 per annum
(No other fee in any name or guise is permissible except transportation and Hostel fee as stated below and placement fee of Rs. 1,000 from the willing students of final year in stead of being collected from all the students at the time of admission).
 - (b) Transportation Fee :
As per actuals from willing students.
 - (c) Hostel Fee :
Rs. 1,200 per month for single seated accommodation and Rs. 600 per month for stored accommodation subject to actuals whichever in less.
2. For M. C. A. Course :
Tution Fee —Rs. 36,000 per annum
Placement, Transportation and Hostel fee as per Engineering Course at serial No. 1
(No other fee in any name or guise is permissible).
3. Marine Engineering :
Tution Fee —Rs. 40,000 per annum
Placement, Transportation and Hostel fee as per Engineering Course at serial No. 1
(No other fee in any name or guise is permissible).
4. M. Tech. Engineering :
Tution Fee —Rs. 40,000 per annum
Placement, Transportation and Hostel fee as per Engineering Course at serial No. 1
(No other fee in any name or guise is permissible).

As per the decision of Hon'ble Supreme Court the students will be required to deposit the turion fee in shape of Bank Draft and no employee or any other person employed by the management of the College/Institution shall be entitled to accept/take the fees in cash from the student concerned directly.

The Institutions/Colleges should be impressed upon to bear in mind the dictum of Hon'ble Supreme Court that imparting education is essentially charitable in nature and their motto should be to produce quality technical personnel in different faculties for the betterment of the State.

Further, the above prescribed Tution Fees shall also include the Insurance Fee and hence the Colleges/Institute can deposit the full amount (towards Insurance Fee) with the B. P. U. T. or the B. P. U. T. can collect the entire amount from the institute at the time of counselling.

If it is found that any Institution has collected any other fee in any name or guise, the same will be seriously viewed and Government may consider to withdraw the N. O. C. and may move A.I.C.T.E. for withdrawal of approval in favour of the defaulting Institution/College. Government may also impose penalty on the defaulting Institution/College as per the judgement of Hon'ble Supreme Court.

While considering the report of the Committee, Government have decided that for the year 2004-2005 if total fees including other charges realised from the students is less than the fee decided by the Committee then the balance amount will not be recovered from the students. But if the fees realised from students during 2004-2005 is higher than the fee decided by the Committee then the excess amount will be adjusted against the fees for academic session 2005-2006.

Any clarification on the above prescribed fee-structure, if so necessary, the decision of the Government in Industries Department is final and binding.
