The Government of Orissa in the Labour & Employment Department in exercise of the powers conferred upon them under sub-section (5) of Section 12, read with clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947) have referred the following disputes vide their Order No. 9747(5), dated the 6th November 2006 for adjudication of the following dispute :—

SCHEDULE

“Whether the termination of services of Shri Kanhu Mahara, Ex-Night Watcher by the management of M/s. Khuntabandha Service Co-operative Limited, Khuntabandha with effect from the 31st July 2005 by way of premature retirement is legal and/or justified ? If not, to what extent of relief he is entitled to ?”

AWARD

2. The workman is absent. He is absent on repeated calls. No steps taken for complying the Government's order. The workman not filed the statement of claims as served opportunities are given to him, notwithstanding the mandate given to dispose of the case within six weeks. Notice issued to the workman by registered post. It appears that the service of the notice is held to be sufficient as the postal cover is shown to be received back.

Hence 'No Dispute Award' is passed accordingly.
