AWARD

The Government of Orissa in the Labour & Employment Department in exercise of powers conferred upon them by sub-section (5) of Section 12, readwith Clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947) have referred the following dispute for adjudication vide their Order No.7010—li/1(B) 17/2007-LE., dated the 26th May 2007.

“Whether the termination of services of Shri Fakir Behera, Petro Salesman/Helper by the management of M/s Jay Auto Centre, Kalpana Square, Bhubaneswar Branch at Uttara, District Puri with effect from dated the 18th December 2005 is legal and/or justified? If not, what relief Shri Behera is entitled to?”

2. In this case neither the second party nor the first party have filed their respective claim statement and written statement. Both the parties have also not taken any steps in the matter. From the conduct of the parties it can reasonably be inferred that they are no more interested to contest the proceeding perhaps for the reason that the dispute has been settled between them amicably out of the Court. In the circumstance, a No Dispute Award is passed in so far as the present reference is concerned.
