## AWARD

The Government of Orissa in the Labour & Employment Department in exercise of powers conferred upon them by sub-section (5) of Section 12, read with Clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947), have referred the following dispute for adjudication vide their Order No.—7672-li/1 (BH)-75/2000-LE., dated the 22nd June 2002 :—

“Whether the action of the management of M/s. F.D.C. Ltd., in terminating Shri Sanjay Banarjee, Medical Representative from service w.e.f. the 24th October 1998 is legal and/or justified ? If not, to what relief he is entitled ?”

2. In this case the second party has neither filed the statement of claims nor took any steps to contest the proceeding. The first party though filed its written statement remained silent thereafter and took no step. From the conduct of the parties, it appears that they are no more interested to contest the case perhaps for the reason that the dispute referred for adjudication has been settled between them amicably out of the Court or that there subsists no dispute at present between them. In the circumstance a ‘No Dispute Award’ is passed in so far as the present reference is concerned.
